My father was born in the dining room on a day bed, at 4336 Fairmount, Kansas City, Missouri.

Dad lived most of his life in that house.

Dad was a member at Immanuel Lutheran Church for 81 years. He served as a church trustee, a choir member, and made himself available for numerous odd jobs around the church. He gave generously to the church.

He spent 26 years as head of Boy Scout Troop 86. He took the scouts on numerous trips to Osceola, Missouri, Boy Scout Camp and Philmount Scout Ranch in New Mexico.

Dad served in the U. S. Navy on the U.S.S. Arkansas during World War II as a Electrician's Mate, Third Class (T), SV6 USNR. Date of entry into active service was December 26, 1943. Date of Honorable Discharge October 31, 1945. I went on active duty October 31, 1965, 20 years to the day my dad was discharged from the Navy. Every October 31st, we were either together or talked on the phone.

Dad not only worked for the phone company but did work for other people, including yard work to carpentry and plumbing. He worked at church doing all kinds of repairs (noted for his plastering) and took care of Aunt Ingeborg's (Henry's sister) rental house 4640 Fairmount when the Ferns lived in it. I can never remember, until dad became much older, anyone coming to the house to do any kind of repairs (except possibly refrigerator repair) because dad or gramps's did it all. I think in some way or another one or more of us boy's was always required to help dad whenever he did remodeling or repairs around the house. It was really a family activity. Everyone in the family was involved when it came time to do wallpapering, painting, roofing or just about any other task. Dad did all of his own work on his car's as well. We also did our share of helping mother. We learned a lot by helping.

Dad was a Key System Installer for Southwestern Bell Telephone Company for 33 years.

Dad saw to it that we had a vacation every summer. We went to the Ozarks many summers and to Yellowstone National Park twice. We visited relatives in Chicago, Omaha, Milwaukee, Topeka and Osage. I can remember going to Harbor Point, Michigan, Eli Lake Minnesota, Seattle, and the Black Hills. No matter where we went, dad never seemed to sleep well. He liked his bed at home. We always brought food to eat on the way, seldom did we eat out. When ever possible, we would stay with friends or relatives on the way or when we arrived.

Dads hobbies were hunting, some fishing, boy scouts and later he took up golf. He did sing in the church choir, worked as a trustee and served as a church board member. Dad was a union steward at work and was for many years in charge of getting the tree and decorations for the office Christmas party. We would get the tree after the party so we never had our tree until very close to Christmas.

Mother was a Dental Assistant before she got married. She did not go to school to do that job like they do today. Mother's main occupation was to be a mother which was the thing to do in those day's. Because of the size of the family, she was a mother during W.W.II also. The only job I can remember mother having outside the home was a very short time being a clerk at Jones Department store when I was in high school. The best and most efficient job was to raise four boy's and take care of a husband. She was a good shopper, seamstress, cook, and all the rest of the thing's necessary to take care of running a household. It was not until later, when Bob and Andy were in college or married, that mother began to do her millenary work (making Hats), toll painting, and decoupage. She was always involved in church work, ladies' aid, church choir and then some volunteer work at the hospital. She was a Gray Lady and on the Trinity Lutheran Hospital Auxiliary.

Mother not only spent time with dad and us boy's she helped her mother and dad as they got older. She drove us kid's and later her folks to all kinds of activities. Ahbo and mother did a lot of shopping together. They would look for sales down town at the department stores and it was an annual event to go to the after Christmas sales. I still remember them. Don was such a pain to have along. He never wanted to go I don't remember mother having much time for herself when we were growing up. I guess that was true for all large families. Her hobbies were sewing, tole painting, hat making, needle point and embroidery.
